#### ST. FRANÇOIS de LAVAL – May 6 (Tuesday)

- patron of the bishops of Canada

He was born April 30, 1623 in northern France, one of eight children in a family of minor nobility. He was tonsured (enrolled as a member of the clergy) at the age of eight and received a benefice (financial income from the Church) when fourteen. When his two older brothers died, he, now twenty-one, was head of the family and had to leave his studies for about two years to attend to family financial affairs.

He was ordained a priest on May 1, 1647, and ministered to the sick and to abandoned children. In 1653 he was proposed to govern the Church in Tonkin (now Vietnam) but Portugal objected to such French involvement in that part of the world. On June 3, 1653 he was chosen to be bishop and vicar apostolic of New France, of which the Archbishop of Rouen (in France) thought he should be in control. In spite of that Laval was consecrated a bishop on December 8, 1658 and arrived in Quebec City on June 16, 1659. There he founded a seminary in 1663.

He officially became bishop of Quebec in 1674 and retired as such in 1688, but lived in Quebec and filled in during the absences of his successor in 1694-97 and 1700-08. He died at the seminary on May 6, 1708.

In theory the Diocese of Quebec covered all of North America except Spanish territories. What was to become Calgary was part of the Archdiocese (from 1819) of Quebec until 1844.
