For example, if we give up steak and lobster during Lent, we have more money to give to TIA. There was once the idea (or the ideal) that we, through our Lenten sacrifices, would reach the parish goal by Easter.

DATE OF EASTER

The Council of Nicaea (325) is credited with setting the date as the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal (spring) equinox.

The earliest date is March 21 and the latest April 25.

ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD, March 25 (this Tuesday)

It is nine months before Christmas, celebrating the birth of Jesus.

Thus, the Annunciation marks his conception when the Angel Gabriel asked Our Lady if she would consent to be the mother of the Son of God. As this was the beginning of Redemption (the Word became flesh, as in the Creed), in England it was, until 1752, New Year's Day, which, in Catholic countries, was, from 1582, January 1.
