# THIS SUNDAY - LAETARE SUNDAY

'Laetare' in Latin means rejoice.

It is from the introit, the entrance antiphon of this Sunday's Mass – "Laetare, Jerusalem" from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, chapter 66, verse 10. This Sunday, in the middle of Lent, is sort of a breather, a moment of relaxation from the rigours of Lent.

Instead of the penitential purple or violet vestments, rose vestments may be worn.

However, because rose vestments may be worn only today and on the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday), most parishes, including St. Elizabeth's do not have them.
