MARRIAGE IN THE LORD (from Catechism of the Catholic Church) cont'd

1628 “The (marriage) consent must be an act of the will of each of the contracting parties, free of coercion or grave external fear. No human power can substitute for this consent. If this freedom is lacking the marriage is invalid.

1629 “For this reason (or for other reasons that render the marriage null and void) the Church, after an examination of the situation by competent ecclesiastical tribunal, can declare the nullity of a marriage, i.e. that the marriage never existed. In this case the contracting parties are free to marry, provided the natural obligations of a previous union are discharged.

ST. CATHERINE OF SIENA – Wednesday, April 29

She was born in Siena in central Italy, probably in 1347, the youngest of twenty-five children. When sixteen, she received the habit of the third order of St. Dominic. She worked among the poor of her city and helped bring about the conversions of sinners. She did not hesitate to offer advice to the pope. She died in 1380 and was declared a Doctor (that is, Teacher) of the Church in 1970.
