ST. BARTOLOMEW, Apostle – Monday, August 24

In the Gospels according to Matthew, Mark, and Luke he is named as one of the Twelve. In the Gospel according to John, someone named Nathanel is mentioned. Probably they are one and the same. He is said to have been flayed (skinned alive) and is therefore the patron saint of tanners.

ST. LOUIS IX, King of France – Tuesday, August 25

He was born in 1214 and died of typhoid in Tunis, in North Africa, while on crusade in 1270. He ruled France at the time of the building of Gothic cathedrals. St. Thomas Aquinas was a guest of his. The king’s justice was famous for its impartiality.

ST. MONICA, mother – Thursday and ST. AUGUSTINE, son – Friday, August 27 & 28

Apart from Our Lord and his blessed mother, they are the only son and mother in the Church’s calendar. Monica, who died in 387, prayed for years for the conversion of her son Augustine. Her prayers were eventually answered and Augustine went on to become a bishop and one of the Church’s greatest theologians. He died in 430 as his city of Hippo in North Africa was about to be taken by the invading Vandals.

Pope Leo XIV belongs to an order named the Augustinians, which was formally established in 1256, some eight hundred years after the death of St. Augustine.
