ST. BONAVENTURE – Wednesday, July 15

He was born in Italy in 1221, the son of a physician of noble birth. When about twenty he became a Franciscan (still a new order), and when thirty-six was elected Minister-General of the order, which he largely organized. In 1265, Pope Clement IV named him Archbishop of York in England, but he refused. In 1273, he was named a cardinal: “when the papal messengers reached him, he was washing up dishes...he told them to wait until he had finished”. He died on July 15, 1274, at the age of fifty-two. There is a parish in Calgary named for him.
