WORLD DAY for GRANDPARENTS and the ELDERLY – July 26, next Sunday

Pope Francis instituted this World Day to highlight the importance of providing adequate pastoral and spiritual attention to the elderly. It is observed on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus, July 26 (but this year the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time takes over).

THE HOLY CHILDHOOD ASSOCIATION is the Pope's own missionary work for children. If the Church ceases to be missionary, the Church ceases to be Church. A small envelope entitled Children's Mission Collection is attached to this bulletin. It may be used anytime by children or by grown-ups – "Unless you become like children you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 18:3)

ST. MARY MAGDALENE – Wednesday, July 22

She is the first person recorded to have met the risen Lord.

ST. JAMES the GREATER (i.e. the elder of the two apostles named James – Saturday, July 25

St. John was his brother. James was the first apostle to be martyred - in 44. There is a great shrine to him at Compostella, Spain.
