### **THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST (from Catechism of the Catholic Church)**

# 1324 The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself.

# 1326 By the Eucharistic celebration [the Mass] we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.

### **ST. BARNABAS – Thursday, June 11**

He was a Jew from Cyprus. An early disciple, he introduced Paul (Saul) to the apostles, but later the two separated and Barnabas returned to Cyprus where he preached the Gospel. Although not one of the Twelve, he is honoured as an apostle.

### **THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS – Friday, June 12**

This is also the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. Please pray for priests, but not on this day only.

### **ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA – Saturday, June 13**

He was born in Lisbon, Portugal in 1195 and died in Padua, Italy in 1231, having become a Franciscan and a great preacher. He is often called upon by people looking for a lost article.
